Company overview: LochIsle has developed a web services platform that can tie identity and credentials to a wide variety of services and hardware. The first implementation of this technology is the iLoch, an internet-connected door-lock system that allows lock owners and users to manage and monitor their access rights - using a web interface accessible from anywhere.

Technology: The iLoch eliminates the need for people to exchange physical keys by providing each person with one master key that can unlock all the iLoch-enabled doors to which they have been given access at home, work or any other location. The first-generation LochIsle products use Dallas Semiconductor iButtons™ as “keys.” Using LochIsle technology to manage and monitor access control has applications in all facilities ranging in size from personal residences to hotels, from small businesses to large office buildings.

Target customers: Lock and access control equipment suppliers who can embed LochIsle technology in products targeted to property managers, real estate developers, homeowners, small business owners, and home medical care providers.
